

## LRP Author Chosen for Prestigious Award

Senior Fellow Professor Gerard P. Hodgkinson and Research Fellow Dr Mark P. Healey (both at the University of Leeds) received the 'Sumantra Ghoshal Research and Practice Award' for their paper entitled, 'Psychological foundations of dynamic capabilities: Reflexion and reflection in strategic management', at this year's Academy of Management Annual Meeting in Chicago. Their award winning paper was selected from 740 papers submitted to the Business Policy and Strategy Division. Recognizing the paper that best advances research while also deriving important implications for practice, the Ghoshal award commemorates the contributions to business research and practice made by the late Sumantra Ghoshal (latterly Professor at London Business School). In the words of one of the reviewers who evaluated the award winning paper "[it makes] a creative case for the relevance of recent cognitive work on intuition and emotion for dynamic capabilities and strategic decision-making in general." Reflecting on their award, Professor Hodgkinson said, "The receipt of this award is particularly meaningful to me personally because Sumantra, who coincidentally was also a Senior AIM Fellow, became a close colleague and friend in the months prior to his untimely passing." More generally, the award marks an important step in Hodgkinson and Healey's ongoing research to develop a new understanding of the management of organizations based on recent developments in social neuroscience and neuroeconomics.

In June 2009, Professor Hodgkinson had the relevant article "Intuition in Organizations: Implications for Strategic Management" published in LRP 42/3.
